Director's Notes

On behalf of all the members of the festival team, welcome to the 9th Reel Shorts Film Festival! We are thrilled to bring you a record number of films - 108 from 25 countries that were selected after considering 4,280 films including 3,780 submissions from 108 countries. More than half of the films in the program are world, North American, Canadian, or Alberta premieres, and many of them are award-winning.

I'm thrilled that we have seven Peace Region films in the program this year. Two were made in Vancouver by filmmakers who grew up in Grande Prairie, and five were made in the Peace Region by resident filmmakers. At least one screens in each of the evening packages on Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday, and they can all be seen in the Peace Region Encore package on Saturday when Decca Industries presents the Best Peace Region Short Award and \$500 cash prize.

This year marks a new collaboration between the festival and PRIMAA: the Filmmaker Insights workshop and panels. By working together to offer these great opportunities to learn from award-winning filmmakers, our organizations achieve our common goal: the development of a thriving filmmaking community in the region.

PRIMAA (Peace Region Independent Media Arts Association) and the festival have joined forces for the second year in a row to offer the Frantic48, a 48-hour film challenge the weekend of April 24-26. The top films will screen at the Frantic48 at 7:30 pm on Fri, May 8. Prizes of \$500 will be presented by Community Futures to each of the winners of the Frantic48 Best Film Award and Frantic48 Audience Choice Award.

Monty Simo, President of the PRI-MAA Board, is the creative force behind this adrenaline-filled weekend of filmmaking in the Peace Region. At 6:00 pm on Fri, April 24, each team will draw a subgenre as well as a genre for their film, and by 6:00 pm on Sunday, they will have completed a short film of 2-7 minutes using an assigned prop and line of dialogue (the same for all teams) in order to be eligible for prizes. Finishing in 48 hours will be a huge accomplishment!

This workshop will cover every aspect of the filmmaking process, from concept to creation. International award-winning filmmaker Cody Blue Snider will walk you through every stage of the filmmaking process for his short "Fool's Day." **Concept:** Coming up with the right idea. (How to know you have a story worth writing.)

Script and story: The most important phase. Script length? Knowing your genre. Short story structure vs. feature structure. Universal laws of successful storytelling. (My personal writing process.) Getting and taking notes. Addition by subtraction in writing.

Budget and raising money: Running a successful Kickstarter campaign. Where to spend and where to be cheap.

Pre-Production: What makes up preproduction? Where your movie is made. Casting. Location scouting. Deals and favors. Problems with using favors. (What is pre-production and why it is crucial where your movie is made.)

Production: What comprises production? Where your movie is destroyed and how you can minimize the damage. Cody's set commandments.

Post Production: What comprises post production? What each phase entails. An overview of: editing, sound design, sound mixing, color correction, special FX, music acquisition and working with a composer. Screening your film and receiving notes successfully.

Film festival strategy: What is a film festival strategy? How to submit to festivals. Why you shouldn't get down if you get rejected. How to optimize your chances of acceptance. Film festival politics.

Doing the festival circuit: What you can accomplish by traveling the circuit and how to capitalize on your success when you have it.

ALSO: Why you make a short film. Short film distribution. Secrets to acquiring representation. Capitalizing on heat in Hollywood.

SCOTT BELYEA

Scott Belyea is a Vancouver filmmaker who grew up in Grande Prairie. Scott directs commercials for Barbershop Films and has several feature-length scripts in development with his production company, Ricebrain Media. Five of the short films Scott has written, directed, and edited have won awards during their festival tours including CHILDREN OF THE DARK which won the Audience Choice award and Best Film award at the 2011 Bloodshots Filmmaking Challenge. It went on to screen at many film festivals including the Toronto After Dark Film Festival where it received glowing reviews.

Scott has developed and led a progression of training initiatives at the Reel Shorts Film Festival from the very first one in 2007. He developed a 2½-day Youth Filmmaking Challenge workshop for the 2009 festival and led it for the next four years, creating 11 short films that were hits with the fest's audiences. It was replaced with more ambitious training programs during the fest's production of two short films: The Horizon Project, created during Shoot for Reel, a 2-week internship program

in July 2012, screened at festivals in Canada, the US, and Europe; and HB, created during a spring 7-week Youth Film Mentorship Project in 2013, screened at festivals in Canada and the US, winning Best Overall Youth Short Film at the 2013 Calgary International Film Festival and the Young Filmmakers Program Competition Grand Prize at the 2013 Austin Film Festival.

In addition to being a judge for the Frantic48, Scott will be a panelist on the Filmmaker Insights Panel 1 (Looking for Laurels – Festival Circuit Tips from the Pros) at 2:30 pm on Sat, May 9.

Scott is the Writer/Director of OUTSIDE THE LINES. Along with Composer Chris McIntyre, he will participate in a Q&A after it screens in the A Criminal Act film package at 8:45 pm on Thur, May 7. The film can also be seen in the Peace Region Encore package at 6:00 pm on Sat, May 9 when the award for Best Peace Region Short will be presented by Decca Industries.





CODY BLUE SNIDER

Cody Blue Snider is an award-winning filmmaker and acclaimed music video director. Born in New York, he was raised by Twisted Sister front man Dee Snider and a small pack of stray cats. He is currently based in Los Angeles, preparing to make his feature-length adaptation of FOOL'S DAY which won the Audience Choice Award at the 2014 Reel Shorts Film Festival.

At age 19, Cody dropped out of film school to write, direct, and edit his debut short drama ALL THAT RE-MAINS which won awards internationally. The film's success propelled him into professionally directing music videos which have repeatedly been hailed as "one of the year's best metal videos" by AOL Noise Creep, Fearnet, Revolver Magazine, and Kerrang. Along with critical acclaim, his metal music videos have received millions of views online and the attention of 14-year-olds living in the Midwest who occasionally message him on Facebook.

Cody's irreverent short comedy FOOL'S DAY had its world premiere at the 2013 Tribeca Film Festival and has won over 40 awards internationally including Best Narrative Short at the Austin Film Festival and Best Short Film at the 2014 Seattle International Film Festival. The film was #1 on the Hollywood Reporter's Viewfinders list 2013 which acknowledged the best short form content of the year as voted on by top industry executives. Buzzfeed called it "the best short film I've ever seen."

In addition to being a member of the jury, Cody will present the Filmmaker Insights Workshop (Fool's Day – Concept to Creation) at 10:00 am on Sat, May 9. He'll also be a panelist on the Filmmaker Insights Panel 1 (Looking for Laurels – Festival Circuit Tips from the Pros) at 2:30 pm on Sat, May 9 and Filmmaker Insights Panel 2 (Moving on Up – Turning Short Film Success into a Feature Debut) at 4:15 pm on Sat, May 9.



JOSH MILLER

Josh Miller is an award-winning writer/producer and President of Panacea Entertainment, an independent film and TV production company in Edmonton, Alberta. Following a successful TV writing career in Hollywood, he served as Director of Development for SuperChannel from 1990 to 1995 before becoming a partner at Minds Eye Entertainment from 1995 to 2003.

Long form producing credits include FORSAKEN starring Donald Sutherland, Kiefer Sutherland and Demi Moore (in post-production); I THINK I DO starring Mia Kirschner and Sara Canning; FREEZER BURN: THE IN-VASION OF LAXDALE starring Tom Green and Crispin Glover; and INTERN ACADEMY starring Dan Aykroyd, Dave Thomas and Dave Foley.

Dramatic television producing credits include the series ANASH AND THE LEGACY OF THE SUN-ROCK (13 episodes), MYTH QUEST (13 episodes), 2030 CE (26 episodes), and MENTORS which Josh also created and show ran (52 episodes).

Factual television credits include the series A TOTAL WRITE-OFF! (13 episodes) and the travel series GREAT CEMETERIES OF THE WORLD (26 episodes) as well as documentaries in a variety of genres including true crime. As President of his own company (Panacea Entertainment), Josh's first production was CATCHING THE CHAMELEON, an hour-long documentary about RCMP Constable Andy Seidemann's four-year pursuit of an elusive pedophile who was permanently put behind bars as a result of Andy's efforts. Andy was subsequently stationed at the RCMP detachment in Grande Prairie before retiring in 2014.

Josh has a BA in English and Drama from the University of Alberta and an MFA in Film Production from NewYork University. He was a Screenwriting Fellow at the American Film Institute Center for Advanced Film Studies in Los Angeles.

Josh has earned dozens of awards for his work both as a writer and producer, but is most proud to have received the Alex Barris Mentorship Award from the Writers Guild of Canada in recognition of his commitment to mentoring emerging writers.

In addition to being a member of the jury, Josh will be a panelist on the Filmmaker Insights Panel 2 (Moving on Up – Turning Short Film Success into a Feature Debut) at 4:15 pm on Sat, May 9.

BRIAN MOREY

Brian Morey is a 20-year veteran of the Canadian film and television industry during which time he has been a writer, story editor, development executive and hand model. He got his break as story editor on BLOOD & DONUTS, which, contrary to popular belief, is not a shocking, behind-the-scenes look at coffee shop working conditions. This was also the film where Brian's hand was first used in an insert shot.

Brian attended the Canadian Film Centre's Writers' Lab in 1998 and its Professional Screenwriting Program in 1999. Also in 1999, he wrote WHEN SHE COMES BACK, a short film that was produced under the CFC's Short Film Program. His education was further enhanced while participating in the National Screen Institute's feature film program in 2002 with a script he wrote entitled NEAR DEATH. The fact this magnum opus has never been produced remains a gaping, festering wound on the body of world culture.

In between bouts of professional development, Brian had a few feature scripts optioned including LOVE-SICK (49th Parallel) and STRAIGHT SHOOTERS (producer Miranda de Pencier). He was also hired to write an adaptation of Owls in the Family, Farley Mowat's classic children's book, which received development assistance from Telefilm Canada and the Harold Greenberg Fund. The fact that none of these movies has been produced (yet) is solid proof of the "genius destined to go unrecognized in his own time" principle. Probably. Brian wrote three teleplays for the Canadian television series PARADISE FALLS that actually did manage to see the light of day.

Having grown weary of the glamour, easy riches and ecstatic public acclaim that is the inevitable reward of Canadian screenwriting, Brian joined the ranks of Copperheart Entertainment Inc. in 2008 as Head of Development for both feature film and television. During his tenure,

films like YOUNG PEOPLE F**KING. SPLICE, HAUNTER (once again Brian's talent as a hand model was utilized), 388 ARLETTA AVE, WOLVES, and DEBUG managed to get made despite his best efforts to thwart them creatively. He was similarly unsuccessful in guashing DARKNET, a half-hour horror anthology TV series first broadcast on SuperChannel and now available on Netflix. Look for A CHRISTMAS HORROR STORY, Copperheart's most recent feature film, to ruin your seasonal holiday in 2015.

In addition to being a member of the jury, Brian will be a panelist on the Filmmaker Insights Panel 2 (Moving on Up - Turning Short Film Success into a Feature Debut) at 4:15 pm on Sat, May 9.

KEELY AIOÑA

Keely Aloña is a 14-year-old actress in Los Angeles who began her acting career at the age of six when she started working in community theatre. By the age of ten, she had performed with a professional children's theatre, an opera company, a musical theatre company, and had done a professional run of Annie for four months. Through one of the theaters, she was cast in her first short film which led to several national TV commercials. An actor's workshop in Chicago introduced her to a casting director who suggested Keely come to Los Angeles. Since moving to L.A. in 2012, Keely has worked on eleven short films, several TV commercials, a music video and a feature film, FIRE CITY: INTERPRETER OF SIGNS, which is being released in 2015. Friendship and acceptance are important to Keely so being cast in STEALTH holds a special place in her heart!

Keely will participate in a Q&A after STEALTH screens in the Identity Paradox package at 6:00 pm on Thur, Mav 7.



CHRIS BEAUCHAMP

hris Beauchamp is a writer, filmmaker, and photographer based in Grande Prairie. He was first introduced to filmmaking when he interned on the Reel Short's Shoot for Reel project in July 2012 (Scott Belyea's film, THE HORIZON PROJECT). The project opened up a number of new opportunities for collaboration in the Grande Prairie arts community and sparked a lasting interest in filmmaking.

Chris then worked as the Director of Photography on Rory Mells' 2013 short film SOPHIA as well as getting involved in several other projects.

As part of his day job as Creative Director at marketing agency nine10 Inc., Chris co-wrote and produced (Cont'd on Pa. 16)

the 2014 ARNIE THE VIKING commercials and webisodes on behalf of nine10 client and festival supporter Hansen Ford Lincoln.

Chris is a PRIMAA (Peace Region Independent Media Arts Association) board member and helps organize the Frantic48 and the Filmmaker Insights workshop and panels. He continues to be a part of the region's burgeoning film community, and has participated in the Frantic48 in both 2014 and 2015. Look for his "Bourbon and Scotch" team's film in the Frantic48 package at 7:30 pm on Fri, May 8 when Community Futures will present the awards for Frantic48 Best Film and Frantic48 Audience Choice Award.

Over the past two winters, Chris braved -30 winter temperatures as

the Director of Photography on Gordie Haakstad's short film COLD DECI-SION which will have its world premiere in the Choices package at 8:45 pm on Wed, May 6.

In 2013, Chris submitted a script to the Reel Shorts' screenwriting competition and won an award and funding to produce his first short film, THE DEVICE. Along with Producer (and wife) Laura Beauchamp, actors Cam White and Tim Heimdal, and composer Chris McIntyre, Chris will participate in a Q&A after its world premiere in the Travel Exchange package at 8:45 pm on Tues, May 5. The film can also be seen in the Peace Region Encore package at 6:00 pm on Sat, May 9 when the award for Best Peace Region Short will be presented by Decca Industries.

DEVON BURBANK

Devon Burbank is a 19-year-old Grande Prairie filmmaker best known for her work as a theatrical makeup artist, writer, and director. Devon began her filmmaking career in July 2012 as an intern and actor in the festival-producedTHE HORIZON PROJ-ECT directed by Scott Belyea. She then wrote, produced, and directed her first short film, HOUSE CALL, which world premiered in the 2013 festival. Devon was the head makeup artist on the festival-produced Youth Film Mentorship Project film HB and was responsible for makeup, props, and costumes for Rory Mells' short film SO-PHIA which she also appeared in.

Devon's second short film, THE VISI-TOR, screened at the 2014 festival. She was also part of the team that won the juried Frantic48 Best Film Award in 2014. She also won the Best Youth Screenplay competition in 2014 with her script Julian.
