

The Documentary 101 workshop is part of an ongoing series of Filmmaker Insights workshops and panel discussions that the fest collaborates on with PRIMAA (Peace Region Independent Media Arts Association). It's great for beginners but has something for anyone who hasn't made their own documentary yet.

Got an idea for a documentary? Learn how to get it made as you work through the five steps to making a documentary:

- 1. Development: What is a good story? How to pitch your story to a broadcaster? What funding sources are there?
- 2. Preproduction: Should you incorporate? How to budget and plan

production? Start promoting now or later?

- 3. Production: How to find your crew? What are releases? How to interview? What do you need to know about shooting ratios and data management?
- 4. Post-production: Why is it said that documentaries are often made in the edit suite?
- 5. Distribution/Release: Do you always need a broadcaster? What about film festivals and non-profit distribution centres?

After completing this workshop, you'll have the tools you need to take your documentary from conception to completion.



Alex will introduce you to key elements before you jump into acting with a scene partner. You will seek to communicate the truth of your character in a grounded, believable, and fulfilling way. You and your scene partner will be filmed and your work will be reviewed to help you delve even deeper!

Gordie Haakstad

Gordie Haakstad is an award-winning feature film writer/director and a managing partner of The Distillery Film Company. Gordie's directorial debut, ABEL'S FIELD, was released by Sony Pictures Home Entertainment in January 2013. It won Best Film, Best Feature, Best Actor, and Best Director awards at The Attic Film Festival in 2015.

Born in Grande Prairie and raised in the United States, Gordie graduated with honors from the University of Southern California's School of Cinema-Television's Production Program. He has helped to create industrial, short and featurelength projects, notably as Director on the award-winning short films ANYONE OUT THERE and The Souvenir.

Gordie taught cinematography and editing at the New York Film Academy,

developing much of the curriculum for those two departments. He moved to Grande Prairie from Los Angeles in January 2013 and taught the Introduction to Video Production course at GPRC (Grande Prairie Regional College) from 2013 to 2015. Since moving to Edmonton in 2016, he's taught the Introduction to Video Production course at FAVA (Film and Video Arts Society Alberta).

Gordie has been involved with the Reel Shorts Film Festival since he judged the Screenwriting Competition and taught the Editing for Filmmakers workshop in 2013. As well as being on the 2014 festival's jury, he judged the Youth Screenplay Competition and mentored the three winners of the 2013 and 2014 Reel Shorts screenplay competitions. He wrote and directed Cold Decision which screened in the 2015 fest. Gordie and Chris Beauchamp wrote and directed The Souvenir which screened in the 2016 fest. Gordie has served on the Board of Directors of the Reel Shorts Film Society since it was founded in 2016. He was a jury member in 2017 and will do so again for the 2018 fest.

Dominique Keller

Dominique Keller was born and raised in Calgary, Alberta. She has directed documentaries set in Canada, the US, France, Kenya, Bangladesh and India. Her projects include several documentaries and documentary series created for clients including CBC, PBS, City TV, The Food Network, NFB, Telus and APTN. Dominique's independent films have screened at over 100 festivals worldwide and premiered on Bravo, CBC and APTN.

Dominique attended the SAIT (Southern Alberta Institute of Technology) Film and Television program and she continues to mentor several new graduates from the program every year. An active participant in the Alberta media arts scene, Dominique is a member of AMPIA, DOC Canada, WIFTA, AMAAS and CSIF. She has instructed several sessions of

documentary storytelling for the New University Television Society and often teaches Documentary Filmmaking 101 for CSIF (Calgary Society of Independent Filmmakers).

Dominique was honored to represent Canada as an artist at both the Beijing Olympics and the Shanghai World Expo. She is currently working on a feature documentary for CBC that follows Alberta and BC's Search and Rescue Volunteers and is in development with the NFB on another documentary about late-in-life romance.

In addition to serving on the Reel Shorts Film Festival's jury, Dominique will teach the Documentary 101 workshop on May 5-6.



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Alex Zahara

After growing up in Grande Prairie, Alex Zahara graduated with a BFA in Theatre from the University of British Columbia and has been acting professionally for 22 years.

Alex is a familiar face in television and film with over 150 credits. He has guest starred in The Man In The High Castle, Riverdale, Once Upon a Time, and Hell on Wheels, and has appeared in Horns starring Daniel Radcliffe, The 9th Life of Louis Drax starring Jamie Dornan, Brain on Fire, and The Assignment with Sigourney Weaver.

Alex co-produced and starred in the feature film Patterson's Wager, which won 14 international film festival awards, and was featured in Variety Magazine. Alex also directed the short film Not Indian Enough which won several festival awards and screened at the 2015 Reel Shorts Film Festival.

Alex has been teaching acting for over 15 years and his clients have had starring and guest roles on Hawaii Five-O, The Practice, Riverdale, Arrow, Supergirl, The Women of Marwen, Once Upon a Time, Star Trek Beyond, Warcraft and many others. In addition to serving on the Reel Shorts Film Festival's jury, Alex will teach the Acting for the Camera workshop on May 12.
