Director's Notes

t's been three years since our last inperson fest! On behalf of the Reel Shorts Film Society Board and all the volunteers who help put on the festival, welcome back!

The challenges that came with the pandemic also revealed a silver lining. Our school program had been the largest in the Prairie Provinces each year from 2017-2019 with 2,000+ Grade 1-12 students attending each year from 15-20 schools in the region. When our venue was closed and no one could attend last year, over 600 people signed up for our Virtual Fest, 123 of them teachers from 36 schools who viewed the school program film packages with their students.

We wanted to provide the advantages of both an in-person fest and a virtual fest this year, so the 2022 Reel Shorts Film Festival is a hybrid fest. Enjoy in-person screenings at Grande Prairie Live Theatre April 26 to May 1, and enjoy on-demand access to the Virtual Fest May 2-8.

We received 7,680 submissions from 137 countries and selected 41 short films from 15 countries. We hope you enjoy them as you travel the world from the comfort of Grande Prairie Live Theatre, your classroom, or your own home!

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Frantic Film Challenge



In Partnership with PRIMAA

The Peace Region's annual film challenge is back! PRIMAA (Peace Region Independent Media Arts Association), in partnership with the Reel Shorts Film Festival, presents the Frantic Film Challenge.

Over the course of an adrenalinefilled 9-day span from March 25 – April 3, 2022, filmmaking teams wrote, shot, and edited a 2-7 minute short film. All teams were required to include preselected, random challenges provided in their starter packages in their films.

The films will screen at The Frantic on Sunday, May 1 at 7:30 and will be viewable online during the Virtual Fest May 2-8.

It's a huge accomplishment to finish a short film in 9 short days. Congratulations to all who accomplished this feat!



Jury Members



Scott Belyea

Scott Belyea is a Vancouver filmmaker who grew up in Grande Prairie. In 2016, he directed HE LOVES YOU NOT, a feature-length thriller for Reel One Entertainment. He currently runs Post Premium Media where he oversees production on various commercial works for major brands.

Short films Scott wrote, directed, and edited have played at festivals around the world, winning various awards. He won Best Peace Region Short at

the 2015 Reel Shorts Film Festival for Outside the Lines.

Scott has developed and led a progression of training initiatives for the Reel Shorts Film Festival that began with the first two-hour workshop for school groups in 2007 and grew into the 2½-day Youth Filmmaking Challenge workshops from 2009-2012.

In 2012, Scott directed The Horizon Project in and around Grande Prairie as part of Shoot for Reel, a two-week program which led to the formation of PRIMAA (Peace Region Independent Media Arts Association). He led the Youth Film Mentorship Project in 2013 during which four Grande Prairie high school students created HB, a short film that won the Best Overall Youth Short Film at the 2013 Calgary International Film Festival. It was the first international film to win the Young Filmmakers Program Competition Grand Prize at the 2013 Austin Film Festival in Texas.

Scott was a jury member when the festival became competitive in 2014. He returned as a jury member in 2016, 2019, and 2021, and is a jury member for the 2022 fest.

It won Best Film, Best Feature, Best Actor, and Best Director awards at The Attic Film Festival in 2015.

Born in Grande Prairie and raised in the United States, Gordie graduated with honors from the University of Southern California's School of Cinema-Television's Production Program. In 2019, his short film, Aeternitas, won him the Alberta Motion Picture Industry Association's Rosie Award for Best Director in the Short Film category and went on to screen at multiple Oscar-qualifying film festivals, as well as the Reel Shorts Film Festival.

Gordie taught cinematography and editing at the New York Film Academy and developed program curriculum before moving to Grande Prairie to teach at GPRC (Grande Prairie Regional College). Since moving to Edmonton in 2016, he's taught the Introduction to Video Production course at FAVA (Film and Video Arts Society Alberta).

Gordie has been involved with the Reel Shorts Film Festival since judging the Screenwriting Competition and teaching the Editing for Filmmakers workshop in 2013. He judged the 2014 Youth Screenplay Competition and mentored winners of the 2013 and 2014 Reel Shorts screenplay competitions. He wrote and directed Cold Decision which screened in the 2015 fest. Gordie and Chris Beauchamp wrote and directed The Souvenir which screened in the 2016 fest.

Gordie served on the Board of Directors of the Reel Shorts Film Society from its founding in 2016 through his final term in 2020. He was a jury member when the festival became competitive in 2014. He returned as a jury member in 2017 and 2018, and is a jury member for the 2022 fest.

Frederick Kroetsch is an Edmonton filmmaker who has created dozens of eclectic projects including the TV series Queen of the Oil Patch and the documentary LAST OF THE FUR

TRADERS (which screened at the 2019 Reel Shorts Film Festival). His latest film, BLIND AMBITION: THE WOP MAY STORY, won the Audience Choice Award and the Alberta Short Film Award for Best Short Documentary at the 2021 Edmonton International Film Festival. That film is part of the On the Job film package, after which Frederick will participate in a Q&A.

In 2021, Frederick directed the new TV series *Dr. Savanna: Wild Rose Vet.* He field-produced on *The Curse of Oak Island*, and, with Neil Grahn, won the Rosie Award for Best Screenwriter (Unscripted Under 30 Minutes) for *Queen of the Oil Patch – "Lost Sisters"*. He also won the Edmonton Artists' Trust Fund.

Frederick is currently an Executive Producer on a documentary TV series for NBC/Universal, and is developing numerous projects.






